SESSION DATE AND TIMES

Dates: Courses will meet **Monday through Thursday, June 4th - June 27th.**

Times: Classes run daily from **7:30 am—12:30 pm.**

Onsite course offered by D200 - \$225.00 for District 200 residents; \$450.00 for non-residents

Online course offered by D200 - \$225.00 for District 200 residents; \$450.00 for non-residents

Driver's Education – Classroom Instruction - \$200.00, plus \$20 for the State of Illinois Permit

Driver's Education- Behind the Wheel - \$270.00

REGISTRATION AND FEE PAYMENT

Your counselor's signature is required to verify course selection and scheduling. Registration forms and fees should be submitted as soon as possible to allow for as many courses as possible to be offered. Checks should be made payable to **District 200 Summer School Program and will be accepted at the Main Office of your student's high school.**

Summer School is an optional program. Therefore, there is no consideration for a reduction or a waiver of Summer School fees. Any student wishing to register **after May 10, 2019, will be charged a \$25.00 late fee** if the course is not already closed due to enrollment limitations. If you withdraw from a class after May 10, 2019, you will be charged a \$25 processing fee.

OUT OF DISTRICT STUDENTS

Students from other school districts are welcome in the District 200 Summer School Program with the exception of **Driver Education**. Out of district students will be required to pay additional fees and be expected to behave in the manner that is appropriate to the school setting. Please pay particular notice to the registration form where it asks for a parent's signature to allow the release of transcripts. In order to assure prompt contact with your homeschool regarding credit earned, this form must be completed.

TRANSPORTATION

Parents are responsible for the transportation of their children. They should see that their student is on time for class and picked up immediately following class. District 200 is not responsible for accidents that occur during unsupervised activities.

ATTENDANCE

For onsite courses students are expected to be in attendance every day. **Upon the third (3) absence the student will be dropped from the course with no credit or refund.** No exceptions are made for any reason.

ENROLLMENT

It is necessary that a minimum class enrollment of 20 be reached before an onsite class can be held.

Driver's Education Behind the Wheel and online courses do not have specific minimum enrollments. In the event that the minimum is not attained for an onsite class, the class will be canceled and each registered student will be notified. The student will have the option to switch to another class or a refund will be issued.

Online Courses

Edmentum - (Credit Recovery Course)

This instructional option involves individual online coursework with optional assistance from D200 instructor. The purpose of this course is to help students successfully recover lost credits. The fee covers the entire summer school period (more than one course can be completed). Students will be allowed to work on coursework independently outside of school, however a D200 instructor will be available Monday - Thursday from 7:30 am - 12:30 pm for support. **Students must come to school to take the final assessment with the D200 instructor.** Upon completion, students will receive a pass/fail grade for each course. **All core courses previously taken will be offered within credit recovery. This is an option only for student who is currently credit deficient.**

Edmentum - (Accelerated Course)

This instructional option involves individual online coursework with optional assistance from D200 instructor. The purpose of this course is to allow students to accelerate their learning. The fee covers the cost for **one** summer school semester long course (**only one course can be completed**). Students will be allowed to work on coursework independently outside of school, however a D200 instructor will be available Monday - Thursday from 7:30 - 12:30 pm for support. **Students must come to school to take all assessments with the D200 instructor.** Upon completion, students will receive a letter grade for the course.

D200 Online Course- 6305 Consumer Ed.

This instructional option involves taking an online course with a D200 instructor through the Canvas Learning Management System. Students will be required to meet in-person during the first day of the course and the remainder of the course will be taught online. This course will follow the D200 6305 Consumer Education course, but in an online format. Upon completion, students will receive a letter grade for the course.

Onsite Accelerated Courses

The courses listed below are for students who want to take additional coursework to get ahead. The course will be taught onsite by a certified instructor during the specified dates and times.

Successful completion of one of these courses will result in earning 5 semester credit hours unless noted.

DRIVER EDUCATION

6113 – Driver’s Education Program

This program has two components: Classroom Instruction and Behind the Wheel instruction. This course is structured to meet the requirements established by the State of Illinois and the Illinois Board of Education. It is mandated that you have previously taken or are currently enrolled in the classroom instruction course in order to be considered eligible for the Behind the Wheel component of the class. To be eligible for a driver’s license, students must receive **6 clock hours** of behind the wheel instruction and observation time.

Criteria for Enrollment into The Driver Education Program

- 6112 Driver Education - Classroom
 - Students must be 15 years of age by May 31, 2019; must have earned a minimum of 30 credit hours and must have passed eight (8) classes in the previous two (2) semesters.
- 6026 Driver Education Behind-The-Wheel
 - Students must be 15 ½ years of age; must have earned a minimum of 30 credit hours and must have passed eight (8) classes in the previous two (2) semesters. Students must be taking or have successfully completed 6112 Driver Education - Classroom.

While you may complete all the registration forms, pay all the fees, and reserve your space, **failure to meet the criteria will result in removal from the course and refund of fees.**
