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Dual Degree presentations to be offered in November for Woodstock, Woodstock North freshman parents

In-person and virtual presentations for parents of high school freshmen in Woodstock Community Unit School District 200 who are interested in the District's Dual Degree program will be held at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 3.

In collaboration with McHenry County College, Woodstock and Woodstock North high school students are offered the opportunity to obtain an associate of arts degree simultaneously with their high school diploma.

The in-person presentations will be held at 7 p.m. on Nov. 3 in each high school's respective library. A virtual presentation will also be available via Google Meet at meet.google.com/mnh-ygrf-neh.

Through a combination of dual credit classes offered at the high schools and courses at MCC, students can graduate with two years of college behind them.

In addition to the significant advantage in college credits, the other benefit is the cost. Students pay a third of the cost of MCC classes and there is no tuition for the high school-based dual credit courses. Students can save thousands of dollars toward their eventual four-year degree by participating in the program.

Students must apply to enroll in the program and obtain recommendations. Students will be notified if they have been accepted by Dec. 6.
